



Beautiful tour of the hill of the Chapel del Pilar de Fayón. This place is full of stories and memories that are presented to the walker from the natural vantage point that this emblematic hill represents. One of the most suitable hikes for a public not used to hiking but that impresses with its aerial images of the dammed Ebro.





It starts at the <u>roundabout</u> at the <u>entrance to the town</u> and runs, at first, along the road that skirts the industrial park. It follows the asphalted track that heads towards the <u>Regaixa jetty</u> until a crossroads, where the PR turns off to the left towards the chapel.

A succession of fields borders the track to the slopes of the hill of the chapel, where you leave the track on a path that leads to some stairs that go up to the terrace of the chapel.

The chapel of Nuestra Señora del Pilar is a place full of stories and memories that are presented to the walker from the natural vantage point that this emblematic hill represents.

Next to the beginning of the parking lot, a gate in the fence allows the passage to the pedestrian path, which meanderingly descends the pilgrim path that, from the old Fayón, climbed the slope of the hill of La Garita to the current chapel.

At the shore of the reservoir, the PR-Z 160 continues along it to the left, with the melancholic vision of the tower emerging from the water under the ruins of the old Castell de Faió.

The track goes up the ravine, passes by the cave of l'Oriola and an old mine, and heads back, among fruit trees, to Fayón.
